## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing a balanced budget amendment to the Constitution requiring that each agency and department's funding is justified.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "Article—
- 4 "Section 1. Total outlays for any fiscal year shall
- 5 not exceed total receipts for that fiscal year, unless three-
- 6 fifths of the whole number of each House of Congress shall
- 7 provide by law for a specific excess of outlays over receipts
- 8 by a rollcall vote, but in no event shall total outlays for
- 9 any fiscal year exceed the following: for the first fiscal year
- 10 for which this article takes effect, 20 percent of the esti-
- 11 mated gross domestic product of the United States for
- 12 that year, and for each subsequent fiscal year, a percent-
- 13 age of the estimated gross domestic product equal to the
- 14 applicable percentage for the preceding fiscal year reduced
- 15 by .1 percentage point. Under this section, total spending
- 16 for any fiscal year is not required to be less than 16 per-
- 17 cent of the estimated gross domestic product of the United
- 18 States.
- 19 "Section 2. The limit on the debt of the United
- 20 States held by the public shall not be increased, unless
- 21 three-fifths of the whole number of each House shall pro-
- 22 vide by law for such an increase by a rollcall vote.
- "Section 3. Prior to each fiscal year, the President
- 24 shall transmit to the Congress a proposed budget for the

- 1 United States Government for that fiscal year in which
- 2 total outlays do not exceed total receipts.
- 3 "Section 4. No bill to increase revenue shall become
- 4 law unless approved by a three-fifths majority of the whole
- 5 number of each House by a rollcall vote.
- 6 "Section 5. Any budget plan for a fiscal year for
- 7 the Government submitted by the President to the Con-
- 8 gress shall include a justification by each department or
- 9 agency of the Government for any funding proposed for
- 10 that department or agency in that plan. The justification
- 11 shall include a justification of each line item in the budget
- 12 of that department or agency based upon its effect on car-
- 13 rying out its mission and its effect, if any, on the gross
- 14 domestic product of the United States and an additional
- 15 funding level below the requested number that would allow
- 16 that department or agency to complete all of its critical
- 17 mission functions.
- 18 "Section 6. Total receipts shall include all receipts
- 19 of the United States Government except those derived
- 20 from borrowing. Total outlays shall include all outlays of
- 21 the United States Government except for those for repay-
- 22 ment of debt principal.
- 23 "Section 7. The Congress shall enforce and imple-
- 24 ment this article by appropriate legislation, which may rely
- 25 on estimates of outlays and receipts.

- 1 "Section 8. The Congress may waive the provisions
- 2 of this article for any fiscal year in which a declaration
- 3 of war is in effect. The provisions of this article may be
- 4 waived for any fiscal year in which the United States is
- 5 engaged in military conflict or after any event which
- 6 causes an imminent and serious military threat to national
- 7 security and is so declared by a joint resolution or during
- 8 which a natural disaster is declared by a joint resolution,
- 9 adopted by a vote by two-thirds of each House, which be-
- 10 comes law.
- 11 "Section 9. This article shall take effect beginning
- 12 with the earlier of the tenth fiscal year beginning after
- 13 its ratification or the first fiscal year beginning after any
- 14 fiscal year in which the budget of the United States is
- 15 not in deficit.".
